- c) The coverage of major events that constitute the chequered history of Pakistan with political, social and economic aspects of the Society
- d) Any other issue of special importance you would like to display at the exhibition.

Please note that the exhibition / display would be arranged in case the Secretariat received sufficient material for the proposed exhibition.
